## Two Mile Walk from Theale: 40-60 Minutes



There are gates on this route. Due to COVID-19 we advise carrying hand gel to use after touching gates.



1. Start on the Englefield Road.

There is a pavement on the right as you walk out of Theale past the new primary school.



2. At the end of the road, carefully cross the A340. This is a busy 50mph road so be aware of traffic.



3. Use the pedestrian gate to the right of the main gate. This is open every day unless locked due to a specific event.



4. Walk a short way up the drive. Turn right onto the permissive walking route. The nath can become muddy



5. Follow the path to a gate that opens onto a field. Go through the gate.



6. You can see the path continues across the field. The path is not surfaced and may become muddy when wet.



7. Go across the bridge. This may become slippery if the surface is wet. There are handrails.



10. Go through the wood until you reach the kissing gate. This is quite narrow to get through.



13. Pavement starts on the lefthand side, opposite the Englefield Village Store.



16. At the end of the drive, go back through the pedestrian gate and carefully cross back over the A340.



8. The path continues across another field. The path may be muddy.



11. Turn left along The Street, Englefield. Here there isn't pavement. Be aware of traffic.



14. Pass the Five-A-Day Garden on your left and the Englefield Garden Centre on your right.



9. Follow the path into the woodland.



12. Along The Street, under the trees, there is a wooden bench. This is 0.9 miles along the route.



15. Turn left. You can follow a mown path through wildflower meadow or the side of the drive.



17. Walk back along the Englefield Road towards Theale.

Once back at the new primary school, you have completed a two-mile route!
